Dear Teague Families,

Happy New Year! We are excited for the return of all students, tomorrow. Please carefully review the information below, as we are resetting for a new semester in anticipation of success for all students.

1. **Please note: adjustments to 2nd semester schedules may have occurred over winter break, for some students, due to new electives, class size balancing and needed interventions.**
2. Beginning Wednesday 1-9-2019, Teague will be implementing a morning Academic Success Center on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 8 am – 8:45 am. This center will provide assistance with homework, computer access and a quiet place to catch-up on an assignment. Students must arrive with a signed permission slip. Please see a copy attached.
3. Beginning Wednesday 1-9-2019, Teague will also be opening the media center, for student use, in the mornings. The time of access will be from 8:50 – 9:10 am. One day passes can be obtained each morning in the front office. A limited number of passes are available.
4. Morning and afternoon tutoring will resume next week. A schedule will be available later this week.
5. Students are expected to follow the SCPS dress code. Shirts must have collars or sleeves. Pants must be above the hips and without thigh high cuts and tears. Leggings must be accompanied with a shirt, skirt or shorts that go to mid-thigh. Bandanas are not permitted. Hats are only permitted during cold weather but must be removed when entering the buildings (All dress codes apply to both males and females).
6. Students are expected to arrive to class on time. Being tardy to class, without a pass, may result in a detention.
7. Appropriate language and behaviors are expected at all times.
8. Each class has a 10-minute freeze time at the beginning and end of each period.
9. For the safety of all students and staff, picture identification badges are required of all staff and students and are to be worn and visible at all time. Replacements can be obtained for a fee of \$5.00.
10. Food and Drink (except for water) are not permitted in the classroom and are not to be removed from the cafeteria. This prevents the occurrence of bugs and rodents.
11. The raised hand, by any staff member, is the campus wide symbol for those in a classroom, meeting, or assembly to become silent and to focus on the speaker.
